

Goals/Objectives

This seminar is designed for primary care physicians, allied health professionals and house staff. At the end of this conference, participants should be able to: 1.) recognize, acknowledge, and understand two common, specific adolescent behavioral health risks (prescription pharmaceutical abuse/disordered dietary practices) that threatens adolescents with an excessive and unnecessary level of morbidity and mortality. 2.) Discuss, describe, and reflect upon the interconnection of the adolescent's psychological and emotional, somatic and spiritual health and well-being. 3.) Summarize, explain, and review issues associated with the recognition, identification, understanding, evaluation, treatment, and management of urinary tract infections and constipation in pediatric medical office practice. 4.) Assess the pediatric patient for primary indicators of autism and differentiate the patients' neuro-behavioral symptom complex with appropriate testing and referral, when appropriate, for further investigation and treatment. 5.) Reflect on, plan for, and consider the use of manual medicine in the care and treatment of the autistic child.

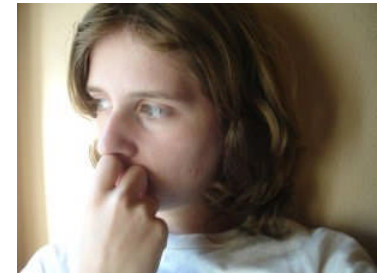
Accreditation

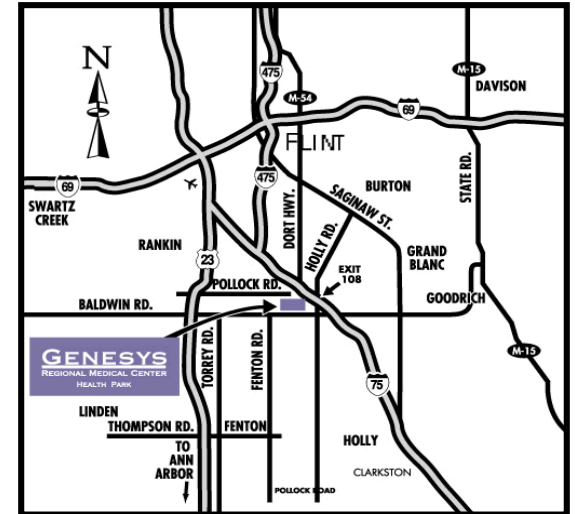
